REPORT ON MONTHLY MEETING – 15th JANUARY 2009

Pathfields – Much work remains to be done but we shall be working with the Parks Department to the design of Val Uglow for the woodland walk. Cyclamen have been planted in pathfields with the help of 6th Plympton Scouts, residents of Closereach and members of the Association. The pond is a an engineering success but the amenity value is a great disappointment to the community.

Barn Meadow(back of Fore Street) Agreement was reached on work to be done.

Plympton Guildhall – The portrait of Admiral Buller is now in place. This leaves four other portraits awaiting restoration.

A Feasibility Study will begin shortly. The future of this listed building will then have to be decided upon.

Castle Mound – Coppicing of the sycamore will eventually be done on a rolling programme. However this is not high priority.

Social Report – The Lamb Feast will take place on Saturday

The Music Festival sub-committee are meeting shortly to start planning for this year's events.

Treasurer's Report – The balance stands at £12,433.25

Plympton Civic Society – There are four candidates for this year's Stannator.

Area Meeting – The permanent location for the library would probably be its original one. Woodford residents were opposed to the choice of Coypool for a waste disposal site and also for a travellers' site.

Calendars – the calendars were very well received and after expenses a profit of £45.61 had been raised.

Sherford – Building will begin at the end of 2010. We have been assured that builders' lorries would not pass through the Conservation Area and the need for traffic restriction on Buller's Hill was still recognised.
