- 1 PATHFIELDS – (Pond) We are awaiting the Planning Application by Pocklington Rise.

- 2. LAND SOUTH OF FORE STREET – The majority of people wish to leave the clump of saplings planted by the Environment Agency. We will ask the City to maintain them.**
- 3. PLYMPTON GUILDHALL – We are still in contact with the City over the future of this building.**
- 4. 40TH ANNIVERSARY-CIVIC ASSOCIATION – Plans are going ahead for various events from 17th to 20th July. Publicity will begin after the Midsummer Festival.**
- 5. MIDSUMMER FESTIVAL – There will be a concert in Plympton St. Maurice Church on 20th June at 7.30 p.m. by the Joshua Reynolds Choir. The Lamb Feast starts at 12 noon on Saturday 21st June ending with Hidden Gardens on Sunday 22nd June – starting at 2.00 p.m. Tickets will be sold at Plympton Guildhall and in George Lane.**
- 6. MUSIC FESTIVAL – Plans are going ahead for this Festival in the autumn.**
- 7. TREASURER’S REPORT – The balance stands are £10,173.90**
- 8. PLYMPTON CIVIC SOCIETY – A minute’s silence was observed in memory of Lynette Robinson. The application to build 13 flats had been re-submitted as it had not been made clear that the developers intend to demolish Alston Hall.**
- 9. PLYMPTON COMMUNITY COUNCIL – The Parade and Ridgeway Fair had been a success.**
- 10. TROUGHS/HANGING BASKETS – Various people had volunteered to take part in planting up ready for the Midsummer Festival and Britain in Bloom.**
- 11. JET WASHING – It had been noted that jet washing of some pavement in Fore Street had dislodged the sand on which these pavoirs are placed.**
