

PLYMPTON ST. MAURICE CIVIC ASSOCIATION

REPORT ON MONTHLY MEETING 20th November 2008

1. **PATHFIELDS** – Chippings will be delivered for the path at the southern end of Pathfields West.
There will be a meeting with a representative of Parks Department to discuss the ongoing plans for the area.
2. **PLYMPTON GUILDHALL** – Admiral Buller painting should be back in the Guildhall before Christmas. A Feasibility Study will go ahead in the New Year.
3. **CASTLE MOUND** – There is a continuing dialogue with English Heritage over the management of the mound. The coppicing of sycamore must be dealt with in a sensible way so that residents in the vicinity do not feel threatened.
4. **BARN MEADOW(BACK OF FORE STREET)** A meeting will take place to discuss how the southern hedge and copse should be managed.
5. **FORESTERS ARMS** – Permission was granted for extended hours but there were a number of conditions. All those who made representations will be informed in writing and then 21 days to appeal.
6. **SOCIAL REPORT** – The Sub-committee was congratulated on this year's Music Festival. The format for 2009 will be discussed in January.
Talk on Plympton and Christmas Lunch – arrangements and ticket sales going well.
7. **TREASURER'S REPORT** – The balance stands at £12,047.84.
8. **PLYMPTON CIVIC SOCIETY** – Plympton Library – It was reported that various records were destroyed in the fire. Members of the Society had offered copies of any material that they might hold. Plans for the new library have been discussed including adjoining Harewood House – it was suggested that the fire engine could be housed in the building.
9. **PLYMPTON COMMUNITY COUNCIL** – It was reported that there is still a problem with antisocial behaviour in Plympton St. Maurice. The revised cycle path in Harewood Park will parallel the Tory Brook.
10. **CALENDARS** – These Plympton St. Maurice Calendars are now available. They will be sold at the two social events before Christmas as well as publicity.
